THE 4J CHÁVEZ STUDENT CARE TEAM MEETS ONCE A MONTH. WE TALK ABOUT WAYS TO HELP YOUR STUDENT SUCCEED IN SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY SUPPORTS THAT CAN ASSIST YOUR WHOLE FAMILY\*. AFTER THE MEETING, YOUR SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER OR A TEAM MEMBER WILL FOLLOW UP WITH YOU.



Things the Student Care Team may be able to help with:

- Finding community resources like housing, utilities, disability services or legal help.
- Connection to Self Sufficiency Program (SSP) benefits such as Family Support and Connections, SNAP (Food Stamps), TANF or Employment Related Daycare (ERDC).
- Help getting support for your child's mental or physical health, behavioral challenges.
- If you are homeless, we connect you to the Homeless Liaison for transportation help and housing wait lists as needed.

*\*A Release of Information is signed by the parent/guardian. You can take back the release at any time. Parents are also welcome to attend the team meeting.*

► Team members may include school counselors/ school social workers, secretary, principal, teachers and other support staff within the school such as the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison. The team also includes Department of Human Services staff from both Child Welfare and Self Sufficiency Program as well Family Support & Connections with Catholic Community Services.
